- Mycha, Kade and Clay are in the process of finishing their EMT's, all clinicals are complete, they are waiting to hear back from their instructor on when they are scheduled to take their exam.
- We have a new Volunteer, Amelia Pickard, who is coming to us with a good amount of wildland certifications and her EMT.

Lisa stated that she has 11 people from the GYO also interested in taking the class. 4 renewals and 7 first-time certifications. A weekend in November was discussed as an option. Galen will check into pricing. Dean stated he would like to be the person to email Al Sisson about offering resort employees the opportunity to join the class.

Volunteer stipend- We have been at \$50 per 24 hour shift for volunteers for years. I
would like to double that, we rarely have volunteers and it would be nice to reward
people putting in their time.

Dean asked how it works for William Gerber? Galen stated Will just does it purely as a volunteer, for free. Pat asked how often Ameilia plans to volunteer and what are the insurance requirements? Galen stated the department has volunteers sporadically, and they operate under GUFD's current insurance policy which has an understanding that there will be some volunteering from time to time. He also states that there are many state regulations on volunteering at fire departments, i.e. volunteers cannot earn more than 20% of the lowest paid employees (hourly or annual) earnings, no more than 10 24hr. shifts per month. GUFD keeps records of hire dates and applications. Galen stated GUFD does not 10-99 volunteers. Mike asked what determines compensation? A completed 24-hr shift? (YES) Mike asked if a max of \$5,200.00 was a large enough annual allowance for all volunteer work? (YES) Lisa moved the Board to allow the pay increase per 24hr. volunteer shift be increased from \$50 to \$100 with an annual cap of \$5,200.00. Motion passed 4-0.
